	Motion that a \$25 fee be charged to families who want to change travel arrangements for all star athletes. If the change causes Pacific to forfeit airfare, the athletes family will be charged the airfare plus \$25 change fee. Reason: Families of all star athletes often decide to use the location of the all star meet as a vacation destination or starting point. Often the change in travel arrangements is made in time for Pacific to change our flight arrangements. A \$25 fee is a minimal fee charged for Pacific to make these changes to the athletes travel arrangements. In some cases, Pacific loses the return air fare. This occurs when the family decides to make alternate travel plans for the athlete at the last minute (or post airline change date.) In this case the athletes family should be charged the change fee and the lost airfare. The no refund policy would stay in tact - with refunds only coming with a note from the athletes physician or death in the athletes immediate family.
