Governance Committee	<ol> <li>Leo Lin – See Report</li> <li>Discussed a possible conflict of interest issue: although conflict of interest can be avoided (as any audit committee member can recuse themselves from the audit of a specific Zone) it was decided, because of the appearance it might create, to recommend that an Audit Committee member should not also hold the position of Zone Treasurer.</li> <li>Looked at what criteria to use to determine whether a person (coach, parent, chaperone) can be eligible to drive swimmers to an event. Discussed looking at the DMV record of the drivers but it is not clear what other factors besides a DUI would deem a driver ineligible. Debbie Tucker will look into what the Vallejo school system does, and Larry Rice will look at what Red Wood City school system does.</li> <li>Discussed USA Swimming's ruling to create Zone Board of Reviews, rather than relying on LSC Board of Reviews. Each LSC will provide 2 representatives to be available to sit on the Zone Board of Review. It was decided that Pacific's two representatives should be appointed by the Executive Committee.</li> </ol>		

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	Interested parties should send their credentials to the Executive Committee for consideration. USA Swimming will provide training and each Zone will pull from their pool of LSC representatives to staff each Zone BOR case. As a result it was felt that the Pacific representatives might be called upon sporadically and should have terms of at least 4 years. The Governance Committee will report their final recommendations regarding these positions after further deliberation.

	(a) Any swimmer qualifying for any level of finals in an individual event who does not		
	wish to compete must scratch within 30 minutes after the announcement of qualifiers.		
	During this period, qualifiers may also notify the referee that they may not intend to		
	compete in consolation finals or finals. In this case they must declare their final		
	intention within 30 minutes after the announcement of qualifiers following their last		
	individual preliminary event.		
	(b) In the event of withdrawal or barring of a swimmer from competition, the referee		
	shall fill the consolation final or final when possible with the next qualified swimmer(s).		
	First and second alternates shall be announced along with the final qualifiers. These		
	alternates shall not be penalized if they are unavailable to compete in the finals.		
	(c) Where consolation finals have not yet been swum and a barring or withdrawal is known to the referee, the referee shall reseed the consolation final and the final, if

	swum without reseeding for the empty lane(s).		
	(4) Checking in for Consolation Finals and Finals (Positive Check-in Meet)		
	(a) Swimmers may check-in or declare their intent to swim finals for that day at the

(b) Swimmers must check-in or declare their intent to compete in consolation finals or finals within 30 minutes of the posting of results. In the case were a swimmer declares their intent to swim they must declare their final intention within 30 minutes after the posting of results for their last individual preliminary event. Swimmers not returning to declare their final intention will be seeded into the event.  (5) Penalty for No-Show at Finals  (a) In a non-positive check-in trials & finals meet any swimmer qualifying for a consolation final or final race in an individual event who fails to show up in said consolation final or final race prior to calling the alternate shall be barred from further competition for the remainder of the meet.  (b) In a positive check-in trials and finals meets any swimmer checking in for a consolation final or final race prior to calling the alternate shall be barred from further competition for the remainder of the meet.  (c) If the No-Show occurs on the last day that the swimmer is entered in an individual event in the meet, and no other individual event penalty is applicable, the swimmer shall then be fined \$25.00. The fine will be increased to \$100 if after 30 days of receiving the letter of notification the party has not made the payment.  (6) Exceptions — No penalty shall apply for failure to withdraw or compete in an individual event if:  (a) The referee is notified in the event of illness or injury and accepts the proof thereof.  (b) It is determined by the referee that the No-Show is caused by circumstances beyond the control of the swimmer.  (c) In a non-positive check-in meet the swimmer qualified for any level of finals due to scratches of one or more original finalists.  (d) The swimmer is an alternate for any level of finals. 	Pacific Swimming's Board of Directors (BOD), the Investment Committee and its Membership are chartered to conduct the financial matters in a prudent manner. Funds have been retained and invested resulting in a positive reserve. The funds are invested in appropriate investment vehicles under management of a professional advisor following a BOD approved Investment Guideline with a short and long term risk portfolio appropriate for the organization.		
	The Investment Advisor reports quarterly to the Investment Committee on the performance of the portfolio and the adherence to the designated asset allocation.		
	The purpose of the funds shall be the preservation of the current principle value but may be used for the following purposes:  Act as a reserve to the annual operating budget  Support annual grant programs as approved by the BOD for the benefit of Pacific Swimming's members		
	<ul> <li>and member clubs/teams</li> <li>Provide reserves for cyclical needs such as Olympic Trials and possible Age Group or Senior travel funding outside of the amounts designated in the annual operating budget.</li> <li>Act as a potential source of funds for major projects approved by the BOD as deemed valuable and integral</li> </ul>		
	for the betterment of Pacific Swimming  It is <b>not</b> the purpose of the funds to provide normal ordinary funding of operating expenses or to supplement normal ordinary sources of income.		
	The funds can be managed and marketed in a manner where outside donations, contributions, estate sharing and other sources of principal growth will be generated.  (Mary Ruddell, Investment Committee)
