DIRECTIONS: From San Francisco: I-280 Take HWY 1 South into Pacifica. EXIT the PALOMA/FRANCISCO exit. Turn Left at the end of the off-ramp stop sign and cross the Highway 1 overpass. After the overpass is a stop sign. Continue STRAIGHT/EAST. After the next stop sign, continue East half block. Oceana Pool is the first driveway on your left. From Half Moon Bay: Take HWY 1 NORTH into Pacifica EXIT the OCEANA/CLARENDON exit. At the end of the off-ramp is a stop sign. Continue STRAIGHT/NORTH about $1 / 4$ mile along Oceana until you reach the next stop sign. At the stop sign take a right to the next stop sign. Oceana Pool is the first driveway on your left. There are three parking lots available on school campus, two on Paloma Ave and one on Oceana Blvd. PLEASE BE COURTEOUS TO THE SURROUNDING NEIGHBORS!

COURSE: 25 yard, indoor heated pool. Up to seven (7) lanes will be used for competition. Separate, warm-up, cool down area will be available during the meet. The minimum water depth for the shallow end course, measured in accordance with Article 103.2.3, is $5^{\prime} 0^{\prime \prime}$ at the start end and $5^{\prime} 0^{\prime \prime}$ at the turn end. The competition course has not been certified in accordance with 104.2.2C (4).

TIME: Saturday and Sunday are split into sessions " $A$ " and " $B$ "

## SESSION A All 13 \& Over Athletes and 11-12 Girls. Meet begins at 8:30AM each day, warm-up from 7:00 to 8:15AM. SESSION B $\quad 10$ \& Under Athletes and 11-12 Boys. Session B will begin one hour after Session A finishes, but not before 1:00 PM each day. Session B warm-up will begin immediately upon completion of Session A.

## RULES:

- Current USA and Pacific Swimming rules and warm-up procedures will govern the meet. A copy of these procedures will be posted at the Clerk-of-Course.
- All events are timed finals.
- Athletes may compete in a maximum of four (4) events per day.
- All athletes ages 12 and under should complete competition within four (4) hours.
- All events will run fastest to slowest.
- Entries will be accepted until the number of splashes exceeds the estimated time line, per the "Four-Hour Rule," based on the athletes age and gender.
- If local conditions warrant it the Meet Referee, with the concurrence of the Meet Director, may require a mandatory scratch down. Immediate cash refunds will be made for any mandatory scratches.
- All athletes competing in the 500 yard freestyle must provide their own lane timers and counters. 9-10 Athletes entered in the 500 freestyle must have met the USA-Motivational "B" Time Standard for their gender.
- All coaches and deck officials must wear their USA Swimming membership cards in a visible manner.

ATTENTION HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETES: If you are a high school swimmer in competition season, you need to be unattached for this meet. It is your responsibility to be unattached from this meet. You can un-attach at the meet if necessary. This does not apply to swimmers swimming under the rules of the Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association (NIAA).

UNACCOMPANIED ATHLETES: Any USA-S athlete-member competing at the meet must be accompanied by a USA Swimming member-coach for the purposes of athlete supervision during warm-up, competition and warm-down. If a coach-member of the athlete's USA-S Club does not attend the meet to serve in said supervisory capacity, it is the responsibility of the athlete or the athlete's legal guardian to arrange for supervision by a USA-S member-coach. The Meet Director or Meet Referee may assist the athlete in making arrangements for such supervision; however, it is recommended that such arrangements be made in advance of the meet by the athlete's USA-S Club Member-Coach.

RACING STARTS: Athletes must be certified by a USA-S member-coach as being proficient in performing a racing start, or must start the race in the water. It is the responsibility of the athlete or the athlete's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement.

## RESTRICTIONS:

- Smoking and the use of other tobacco products is prohibited on the pool deck, in the locker rooms, in spectator seating, on standing areas and in all areas used by swimmers, during the meet and during warm-up periods.
- Sale and use of alcoholic beverages is prohibited in all areas of the meet venue.
- No glass containers are allowed in the meet venue.
- No propane heater is permitted except for snack bar/meet operations.
- All shelters must be properly secured.
- Except where venue facilities require otherwise, changing into or out of swimsuits other than in locker rooms or other designated areas is prohibited.
- Pets are not allowed in the pool area, with the exception of guide and assistance dogs.
- Destructive devices, to include but not limited to, explosive devices and equipment, firearms (open or concealed), blades, knives, mace, stun guns and blunt objects are strictly prohibited in the swimming facility and its surrounding areas. If observed, the Meet Referee or his/her designee may result in reporting to law enforcement authorities and ejection from the facility. Law enforcement officers (LEO) are exempt per applicable laws.
- Operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present.


## ELIGIBILITY:

- Athletes must be current members of USA-S and enter their name and registration number on the meet entry card as they are shown on their Registration Card. If this is not done, it may be difficult to match the athlete with the registration and times database. The meet host will check all athlete registrations against the SWIMS database and if not found to be registered, the Meet Director shall accept the registration at the meet (a $\$ 10$ surcharge will be added to the regular registration fee). Duplicate registrations will be refunded by mail.
- Athletes in the " $A$ " division must have met at least the USA Swimming motivational " $A$ " minimum time standard.

Athletes in the " $B$ " division must have met at least the listed " $B$ " minimum time standard. All entry times slower than the listed " $B$ " time standard will be in the " $C$ " division.

- Entries with "NO TIME" will be ACCEPTED.
- Entry times submitted for this meet may be checked against a computer database and may be changed in accordance with Pacific Swimming Entry Time Verification Procedures.
- Disabled athletes are welcome to attend this meet and should contact the meet director or meet referee regarding any special accommodations on entry times and seeding per Pacific Swimming policy.
- The athlete's age will be the age of the athlete on the first day of the meet.

ENTRY PRIORITY: Zone 1 North athletes from BSC, DACA, DCD, FOG, HDAC, MAV, MCAC, PPSC, PSL, SOLO, SSF, STAR entering online must do so by Wednesday January 24 in order to receive priority acceptance into the meet. Surface mail entries must be postmarked by Monday, January 20th in order to receive priority acceptance to the meet. No athletes other than those from BSC, DACA, DCD, FOG, HDAC, MAV, MCAC, PPSC, PSL, SOLO, SSF, STAR may enter the meet until the preference period has concluded.

ENTRY FEES: $\$ 4.00$ event plus an $\$ 8.00$ participation fee per athlete. Entries will be rejected if payment is not sent at time of request. No refunds will be made, except mandatory scratch downs.

ONLINE ENTRIES: To enter on-line go to http://ome.swimconnection.com/pc/solo20180210 to receive an immediate entry confirmation. This method requires payment by credit card. Swim Connection LLC charges a processing fee for this service, equal to $\$ 1$ per athlete plus $5 \%$ of the total Entry Fees. Please note that the processing fee is a separate fee from the Entry Fees. If you do not wish to pay the processing fee, enter the meet using a mail entry. Entering online is a convenience, is completely voluntary, and is in no way required or expected of an athlete by Pacific Swimming. Online entries will be accepted through Sunday, February $4^{\text {th }}$ at 3:00 PM. Refunds are not available for entries.

CHECK-IN: The meet will be deck seeded. Athletes must check-in at the Clerk-of-Course. No event shall be closed more than 30 minutes before the scheduled start of the session. Close of check-in for all individual events shall be no more than 60 minutes before the estimated time of the start of the first heat of the event. Athletes who do not check in will not be seeded and will not be allowed to compete in that event.

SCRATCHES: Any athletes not reporting for or competing in an individual timed final event that they have checked in for shall not be penalized.

AWARDS: Individual awards will be awarded in the A, B, and C division. Ribbons for First through Third place will be given to the following age groups: 8 \& Under, $9-10$, and 11-12. Athletes 13 years of age and older will not receive awards. Standard " $A$ " time medals will be awarded to athletes achieving NEW USA Swimming motivational " $A$ " time standard, regardless of place achieved in the event. All awards must be picked up at the meet. Awards will not be mailed.

ADMISSION: Free. A program will not be available.

REFRESHMENTS: A small snack bar may be available throughout the competition. A food truck will also be available. Coaches and working deck officials will be provided lunch. Hospitality will serve refreshments to timers.

MISCELLANEOUS: No overnight parking is allowed. Facilities will not be provided after meet hours. All participating clubs are expected to provide lane timers based upon the number of athletes registered to swim each day. Club timing lanes will be assigned and coaches will be notified of assignments during the week prior to the meet.

MINIMUM OFFICIALS: Clubs must follow Zone 1 North rules for providing officials. Each club must provide officials for each session according to the number of athletes entered in that session, following the table below. Clubs that do not provide sufficient officials must provide coaches to act in the place of officials.
